


I am pleased to submit the 2012 annual report of the Wadsworth Fire and Emergency Medical Service department for your review.

This past year the fire department has seen an increase in number of calls by 11.24%, for a total of 249 calls compared to 221 calls in 2011. In addition, a fire officer was requested 134 times for the year. Requests of this nature are to conduct carbon monoxide checks, odor investigations, or any other call where the entire department is not needed.


EMS has also seen an increase in the number of calls for service in 2012. EMS responded to 1861 calls, for an increase of 5.50% over 2011. The majority of these calls were handled by personnel standing by at either station. A third ambulance was required to respond twenty times in 2012. These calls required off duty personnel to respond to the station to take an ambulance or required mutual aid from one of our surrounding departments.

The construction of the four new school buildings and the construction of "The Inn at Coal Ridge" took considerable amount of the inspection bureau's time this past year. The inspectors' outstanding effort insured that the schools were ready to open on the first day of school.

This report will also address training for both fire and EMS, maintenance and operating cost, and public safety education.

Lastly and most importantly, I would like to express my sincere appreciation to the officers, members, and staff of the Wadsworth Fire and EMS Department for their outstanding performances, dedication, and assistance this past year!






Total emergency calls responded to by the Wadsworth Fire Dept. last ten years.



This chart represents the number of emergency calls within the city and within the township. This does not include mutual aid calls or calls out of jurisdiction.




This represents the number of structure fires responded to over the last ten years. Does not include mutual aid calls.




This chart represents the number of false calls and unintentional calls responded to over the last ten years where the fire department was not actually needed.

WADSWORTH FIRE DEPARTMENT MUTUAL AID TREND SUMMARY




This chart represents the number of mutual aid requests received and given during the past ten years, this is now tracked by the department and not incidents.

2012 WADSWORTH FIRE DEPARTMENT ALARM TIME SUMMARY




This chart represents the actual number of emergency calls responded to including mutual aid calls in relationship to the hour of the day.

2012 WADSWORTH FIRE DEPARTMENT RESPONSE TIME COMPARISON



2012 WADSWORTH FIRE DEPARTMENT RESPONSE SUMMARY BY DISTRICT




2012 WADSWORTH FIRE DEPARTMENT DAY/ALARM TIME SUMMARY




This represents the number of emergency calls in relationship to the day of the week and the hour of the day.


WADSWORTH FIRE DEPARTMENT ALARM TIME COMPARISON



This chart represents the number of and the percentage of emergency calls in relationship to the time of day when the emergency calls are received.






2012 Major Inspection Projects

PUBLIC SAFETY EDUCATION – 2012

Since 1989 the Fire Department has been educating the citizens of Wadsworth about the importance of fire safety and prevention, as well as injury prevention. Public Safety Education is comprised of various members of the department.

The public education program season gets started the last week of July and the first week of August with Safety Town where kindergarten age children learn all about safe ways to live.

In that time, students learn the importance of keeping smoke alarm batteries up-to-date, contacting 911, and in a fire situation, getting out of a burning building and staying out. Students are also taught what to do if they find matches and/or a lighter lying around in a room. The children are taught how to stop, drop and roll should their clothes catch on fire.

During the EMS demonstrations the children are instructed on the importance of vehicle seatbelts, bicycle helmets, elbow and knee pads, and how to use them. The children are also shown the rescue equipment used by EMS. The “victims” are immobilized using size appropriate equipment, and they get to see and feel the “magic” of vacuum splints.

The highlight of any fire prevention program is when the students are allowed to pull hose from an engine, flow water, get “rescued” from a “burning building” and try on turnout gear including helmet, gloves and boots.

Members from both fire and EMS are active in presenting safety programs. With the help of these firefighters and paramedics, the citizens receive a well-rounded presentation.

Programs are taught at both fire stations and out in the community at schools, churches or other public meeting places.

The department sees children from the city’s schools, but other groups as well: Cub Scouts, Brownies, churches, and PTA groups to name a few.

This year the department saw about 1074 people from the community and school system. This is a drop from previous years, some of which is due to a couple of pre-schools being dissolved. Also, there were cut backs in time allotments for extracurricular activities in all schools.

One thousand six hundred activity and coloring books were distributed to children in the Wadsworth school system from 1st through 4th grade. Funds for the books are raised through sponsorships from area businesses.

Through the guidance of Chief Ralph Copley, the fire and EMS departments have been able to touch the lives of many people.








Total number of emergency calls responded to by Wadsworth EMS the last ten years.




This chart represents the number of EMS calls within the city and within the township.




A comparison between the number of calls per month for 2011 and 2012.




A comparison of the average monthly response time. This average represents primary or first response only. It does not include second response call times.




This chart breaks down the number of EMS calls per city and township districts as defined by the boundaries described in the Wadsworth Fire Department section of this annual report.





Fire Apparatus Maintenance Cost Comparison



Fire Apparatus Fuel Cost Comparison




Fire Department Average Cost Per Response Comparison



Fire Department Average Cost Per Mile Comparison




Fire Department Average Cost Per Hour Comparison




EMS Apparatus Maintenance Cost Comparison




EMS Apparatus Fuel Cost Comparison




EMS Average Cost Per Response Comparison
