ORDINANCE NO. 21-007

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 76.10 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF WADSWORTH TO ADD CITY PARKS AND PARKING LOTS AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WADSWORTH, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 76.10 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Wadsworth is hereby amended to read as follows:

§ 76.10 OVERNIGHT PARKING.

No person shall park any vehicle on any street, alley, city parks or parking lots contained within the parks of the city between 3:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m., except medical doctors or clergymen on emergency calls.

Section 2. That existing section 76.10 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Wadsworth is hereby repealed.

Section 3. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety in the City of Wadsworth; WHEREFORE, this ordinance shall go into immediate effect provided that it receives a two thirds vote of all members of city council. If it receives approval by a majority of the members but less than a two-thirds vote, then it shall be effective at the earliest time permitted by law.

RESOLUTION NO. 21-02

A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE INTENT OF THE LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF WADSWORTH TO SELL PERSONAL PROPERTY INCLUDING MOTOR VEHICLES ACQUIRED FOR THE USE OF MUNICIPAL OFFICERS AND DEPARTMENTS AND ROAD MACHINERY, EQUIPMENT, TOOLS OR SUPPLIES WHICH ARE NOT NEEDED FOR PUBLIC USE OR ARE OBSOLETE OR UNFIT FOR THE USE FOR WHICH THEY WERE ACQUIRED BY INTERNET AUCTION DURING THE CALENDAR YEAR 2021 ADOPTING PROVISIONS APPLICABLE TO SUCH SALE BY INTERNET AUCTION AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, section 721.15(D) of the Ohio Revised Code makes provision for the legislative authority of an Ohio municipal corporation to adopt a resolution regarding the sale of city owned personal property by internet auction; **NOW THEREFORE**

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WADSWORTH, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That this Council hereby expresses its intent to sell personal property, including motor vehicles acquired for the use of municipal officers and departments and road machinery, equipment, tools or supplies which are not needed for public use or are obsolete or unfit for the use for which they were acquired by internet auction during the calendar year 2021.

Section 2. The auctions shall be conducted on eBay, GovDeals, Craigslist, eBid, Bonanzle, iOffer, ePier, Gov.Planet, Public Surplus or a similar internet auction site. The number of days for bidding on the property shall be ten days or more, including Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays. No property sold in the internet auctions shall be delivered to the buyer until payment in full is received and the city's representative may deduct its standard broker assisted fees. This Council or its representative may establish a minimum price that will be accepted for specific items and may establish any other terms and conditions for the particular sale, including requirements for pick-up or delivery, method of payment and sales tax. This type of information shall be provided on the internet at the time of the auction and may be provided before that time upon request after the terms and conditions have been determined by the representative. This Council will by subsequent resolution authorize the sale of specific items of property and designate and authorize a contract with a representative to conduct the internet auction as to particular items.

Section 3. Notice of the intent of this legislative authority to sell unneeded, obsolete or unfit municipal property by internet auction shall be published twice after the adoption of this resolution in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Wadsworth. The notice shall include a summary of the information provided in this resolution. The second notice shall be published not less than ten nor more than twenty days after the previous notice. A similar notice shall be posted continually throughout the calendar year 2021 in a conspicuous place in the office of the city auditor and of the city council and the notice shall be posted continually throughout the calendar year 2021 at the City of Wadsworth web site on the internet.

Section 4. That this resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety in the City of Wadsworth in order to avoid the burden of keeping property no longer needed for municipal purposes and to obtain additional funds for use in providing public services; WHEREFORE, this resolution shall go into immediate effect provided that it receives a two thirds vote of all members of city council. If it receives approval by a majority of the members but less than a two-thirds vote, then it shall be effective at the earliest time permitted by law.
