





## Ten Year Trends




This chart represents total emergency calls responded to by the Wadsworth Fire Dept. in the last ten years.




This chart represents the number of emergency calls within the city and within the township. This does not include mutual aid calls responded to or calls out of the jurisdiction.

## Structure Fire Trends & False Call Summary




This chart represents the number of structure fires responded to over the last ten years. It doesn't include mutual aid calls.




This chart represents the number of false alarms & unintentional calls responded to over the last ten years where the department was not actually needed.

## Mutual Aid Trends & Alarm Time Summary




This chart represents the number of mutual aid requests received and given during the past ten years.




This chart represents the actual number of emergency calls responded to including mutual aid calls in relationship to the hour of the day.




This chart represent average response time by the month, does not include mutual aid. The average response time for 2014 was 6:32 minutes.



## Day/Time Alarm Summary & Time Comparison




This chart represents the number of emergency calls in relationship of the day of the week and the hour of the day.




This chart represents the number of and the percentage of emergency calls in relationship to the time of day when the emergency calls are received.





Estimated property value of loss and saved for structure fires.








This chart represents the number of fire safety inspections conducted over the past five years.





## EMS Ten Year Trends




This chart represents the total number of emergency calls responded to by Wadsworth EMS over the past ten years.




This chart represents the number of EMS calls within the city and within the township over the past ten years.

## Monthly Comparisons




This is a comparison of the average monthly response time. This average represents primary or first response only. It does not include second response call times.




This chart is a comparison between the number of calls per month for 2013 and 2014.

## Calls by District & Day of Week Summary




This chart breaks down the number of EMS calls per city and township districts as defined by the boundaries described in the Wadsworth Fire Department section of this annual report.




This chart represents the number of emergency calls for EMS in relation to the day of the week.

## Call Comparison & Call Time Summary




This chart represents how frequently other ambulances answered calls besides the first out ambulance.

# **Public Education Activities**

## Public Education Report

### PUBLIC SAFETY EDUCATION – 2014

Since 1989 the Fire Department has been educating the citizens of Wadsworth about the importance of fire safety and prevention as well as injury prevention. Public Safety Education is conducted by various members of the department.

Programs are taught at both fire stations and out in the community at schools, churches or other public meeting places. Members from both Fire and EMS are active in presenting safety programs. With the help of these firefighters and paramedics, the citizens receive a well-rounded presentation.

The primary student public education program begins the last week in July with Safety Town where kindergarten age children learn all about safe ways to live.

In that time, students learn the importance of keeping smoke alarm batteries up-to-date, contacting 9-1-1, and in a fire situation, getting out of a burning building and staying out. Students are also taught what to do if they find matches and/or a lighter lying around in a room. The children are taught how to stop, drop and roll should their clothes catch on fire.

During the EMS demonstrations the children are instructed on the importance of vehicle seatbelts, bicycle helmets, elbow and knee pads, and how to use them. The children are also shown the rescue equipment used by EMS. The “victims” are immobilized using size appropriate equipment, and they get to see and feel the “magic” of vacuum splints.

The highlight of any fire prevention program is when the students are allowed to pull hose from an engine, flow water, get “rescued” from a “burning building” and try on turnout gear including helmet, gloves and boots.

New this year to the Safety Education Program is the addition of the Safety Education Trailer. With the trailer, members can now show students how to feel the heat of a door with the back of their hand, and how to put a kitchen fire out with a fire extinguisher.

Programs are taught at both fire stations and out in the community at schools, churches or other public meeting places. Members from both fire and EMS are active in presenting safety programs. With the help of these firefighters and paramedics, the citizens receive a well-rounded presentation.

Programs have grown in popularity and frequency; not only does the department see children from the city’s schools, but other groups as well: Cub Scouts, Brownies, churches, and PTA groups to name a few.

This year the department saw approximately 1,436 people from the community and school system.

One thousand six hundred activity and coloring books were distributed to children in the Wadsworth school system from preschool through 3rd grade. Funds for the books are raised through sponsorships from area businesses and the National Fire Safety Council.

Through the guidance of Chief Carl Rommel, the Fire and EMS departments have been able to touch the lives of many people.
