



STRUCTURE FIRE TREND SUMMARY



UNINTENTIONAL/FALSE CALL SUMMARY




Mutual Aid Trends & Alarm Time Summary



2017 VS. 2018**






















WADSWORTH EMS CITY VS. TOWNSHIP




WADSWORTH EMS MONTHLY CALL COMPARISON, 2017-2018




WADSWORTH EMS DAY OF WEEK SUMMARY 2018


Call Comparison and Call Time Summary






Fire Apparatus Maintenance Cost Comparison

Fire Apparatus Fuel Cost Comparison




EMS Apparatus Maintenance Cost Comparison

PUBLIC SAFETY EDUCATION – 2018

Since 1989 the Fire Department has been educating the citizens of Wadsworth about the importance of fire safety and prevention. Public Safety Education has been comprised of various members of the department.

The public education program season gets started the last week in July with Safety Town where kindergarten age children learn all about safe ways to live.

In that time, students learn the importance of keeping smoke alarm batteries up-to-date, contacting 9-1-1, and in a fire situation, getting out and staying out. Students are also taught what to do if they find matches and/or a lighter lying around in a room. The children are taught how to stop, drop and roll should their clothes catch on fire.

During the EMS demonstrations the children are instructed on the importance of vehicle seatbelts, bicycle helmets, elbow and knee pads, and how to use them. The children are also shown the rescue equipment used by EMS. The “victims” are immobilized using size appropriate equipment, and they get to see and feel the “magic” of vacuum splints.

The highlight of any fire prevention program is when the students are allowed to pull hose from an engine, flow water, get “rescued” from a “burning building” and try on turnout gear including helmet, gloves and boots. This year we added a new element to the program, putting out a “Cone of Fire!”

In 2014, the department acquired a Safety Education Trailer. With the trailer, members can now show students how to feel the heat of a door with the back of their hand and how to put a kitchen fire out with a fire extinguisher.

Programs are taught at both fire stations and out in the community at schools, churches or other public meeting places. Members from both fire and EMS are active in presenting safety programs. With the help of these firefighters and paramedics, the citizens receive a well-rounded presentation.

Programs have grown in popularity and frequency; not only does the department see children from the city’s schools, but other groups as well: Cub Scouts, Brownies, churches, nursing homes and PTA groups to name a few.

This year the department saw over 2,000 children from the community and school system.

One thousand six hundred activity and coloring books were distributed to children in the Wadsworth school system from preschool through 3rd grade. Funds for the books are raised through sponsorships from area businesses.

Through the guidance of Fire Administration, the Fire and EMS departments have been able to touch the lives of many people.
