

THE DISTRICT MAP REPRESENTS THE AREA THE FIRE & EMS DEPARTMENT PROVIDES SERVICE.







TEN YEAR TREND SUMMARY




CITY & TOWNSHIP TEN YEAR TREND SUMMARY





STRUCTURE FIRE TREND SUMMARY




UNINTENTIONAL/FALSE CALL SUMMARY














**EMS CITY & TOWNSHIP



WADSWORTH EMS MONTHLY RESPONSE TIME SUMMARY 2021-2022





WADSWORTH EMS MONTHLY CALL COMPARISON 2021-2022















PUBLIC SAFETY EDUCATION – 2022

The Wadsworth Fire Department has been educating the citizens of Wadsworth about the importance of fire safety and prevention since 1989. Public Safety Education has been comprised of various members of the department providing safety messages to many different groups in the Wadsworth community.

Public Safety Education is so valuable to the community by raising awareness in the prevention of home fires and how to stay safe.

In June, the First Friday event was held for First Responders. At the event, the community was able to explore fire trucks, ambulances and the Safety Trailer. Children were able to try on turnout gear. Children (even adults) could use a real fire hose to spray water at a fire prop.

Safety Forces Camp was held in June. Middle school students were taught important safety information through interactive activities and classroom presentations. Students also were able to see emergency vehicles.

In July, Safety Town was held for incoming kindergarten students. The children were taught about the importance of smoke alarms and how to call 9-1-1 in an emergency. They learn what to do if there is a fire, and to get out and stay out of a building when there is a fire. They also were taught not to play with lighters and matches, and to stop, drop, and roll if their clothes catch on fire. In the Safety Trailer, they learned how to check a door before opening it and how to put out a fire with a fire extinguisher. The students were able to see the turnout gear the firefighters wear and how the firefighters enter a burning building. In addition, the students were able to put out a “Cone of Fire.” During the EMS demonstrations the children were able to tour the inside of an ambulance. The children were able to experience vacuum splints used in injuries. Fire Pup came to visit the children this year.

In August, National Night Out was held in the Kohl’s parking lot. The ladder truck, squads and the safety trailer were at the event for the community to take a tour in the inside of each. The firefighters held a demonstration of vehicle extrication. This event was for the entire family with not only Fire and EMS present but also Police and other agencies. The Cleveland Clinic helicopter made a landing there as well and available for the community to take a look inside.

In October, during Fire Prevention Week, activity and coloring books with age appropriate materials were provided to children in Wadsworth schools from preschool to fourth grade. Funds for these books are raised through donations from area businesses. Additionally, in October, fire safety information was provided to seniors at the Senior Expo held at the Soprema Senior Center.



The Public Education programs are taught at both fire stations, and out in the community at schools, churches and other public meeting places. Schools bring students to tour the fire stations and the scouts come to learn important first aid information in order to earn their badges. The Fire and Life Safety Educators also provide healthcare fire safety training at healthcare facilities.

The Wadsworth Fire and EMS Department touches the lives of many people in the community to share important safety messages.
